RECIPE OF THE MONTH

BUTTER BEAN BAKE

Ingredients

8 oz cooked butter beans.

These should be soaked overnight. Change water once then cook in fresh water the next day, boiling for 10 minutes then simmered for 35-40 minutes

4 oz sliced mushrooms

4 oz grated Cheddar cheese

2 large onions, chopped

2 sticks of celery, de-stringed and chopped

2 carrots, grated or chopped

5 tomatoes, chopped or use tinned

4 large potatoes, steamed or baked

½ green pepper, chopped

2 tablespoons sunflower oil

2 tablespoons soy sauce

1 teaspoon each of basil, oregano and parsley, chopped

1 vegetable stock cube

Method

Sauté onions, then celery, carrots, pepper and mushrooms for 5 minutes. Add tomatoes, herbs, soy sauce and stock cube, season and simmer for 10-15 minutes. Add butter beans and transfer to ovenproof serving dish. Top with the potatoes (sliced) and cover with cheese. Bake at 200°C/400°F/Gas mark 6 for approximately 10 to 15 minutes until cheese has slightly browned.

MEMORIES OF OLD FARRINGDON FOLK

As told by Roy Skinner of Crealy Barton to his daughter Dawn

Alfie Main lived at Honiton Clyst, delivering post mornings and afternoons on a bicycle. Mother would draw over the bathroom curtains if she wanted him to pick up anything for the post.

Curly Pearce had a motorbike with a side car in which he carried the post. On the afternoon round he would ask if the cellar door of the barn was unlocked so he could have some cider. Some glasses would always be left out.

Charlie Cummings – huntsman.

In the summer, on a Sunday afternoon, he would take the hounds out for exercise and would often call back for a glass of cider. He would leave the hounds to wander about and then, when he was ready, would call the hounds together and go on his way.

Saint Marks lived at Honey Cottage Woodbury Salterton and worked at Crealy. He had only one arm. He would bring a gallon jar to fill with cider to work each day with some pickled onions, homemade bread and cheese.

Saint was very fond of his drink and visited the White Cross pub every night. One dark winter's night he was seen leaving arm in arm with another man, both very tipsy. Instead of turning left back towards Woodbury Salterton, they turned right and ended up in Sanctuary Lane. After a while they were heard to say to one another 'There's water ere, us didn't pass water before did us'. They then proceeded to take matches from their pockets and try to strike them so they could find their way back home.

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

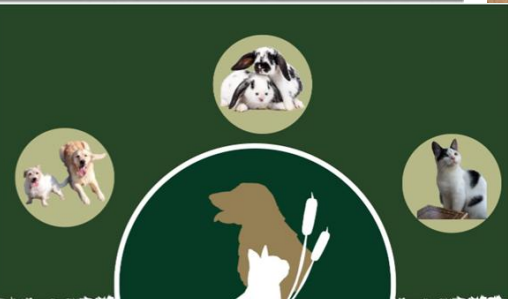
