TEA LOAF

8oz Selfraising Flour

8oz Mixed Fruit

4oz Brown Sugar

6 fl oz Cold Tea

1 Beaten Egg

Soak fruit in cold tea overnight. Then add all the other ingredients and mix together to dropping consistency, adding an extra tablespoon of cold tea if necessary.

Cook for about 1 hour at 350 or Gas 4 in a well greased loaf tin, lining the base with greaseproof paper.

Do not turn out immediately but leave to cool in the tin to avoid cracking.

Very good sliced and served with butter.

“The hall finances remain in a healthy state, still due to the Covid grant received in 2020. The account has gone down from £4606 reported last year to £3977 at 1st May due to the work that has taken place over the last 12 months.

I would like to thank Jerry Bird for organising this work which has been carried out to high standard by local resident Stephen Fricker. The preparatory work for the back and left hand walls was carried out last summer and the plastering and decorating will be carried out as soon as it can.

The hall continues to be hired regularly by several organisations including this year one election.

The hall AGM will be held this year on Wednesday 11th June at 7-30pm and will be advertised in the June Farringdon Flyer. New members of the committee would be welcome including to carry out the various rolls required.”

S73A application for the variation of Condition 3 of planning permission

DCC/3677/2014 (Proposed extension to the area of the existing inert tip) to require the cessation of landfill operations by 31 December 2030. at Hill Barton Business Park, Blackmore Road, Clyst St Mary, Devon, EX5 1DR

Clerk confirmed that in light of DALC advice sought, the comment submitted to the DCC is not sound and should be withdrawn. PC unanimously agreed. Apologies given to applicant for confusion – clerk to action

The PC agreed that the original minuted and recorded comment 16/04/25 should be submitted and to include extra comment (as discussed at this meeting 19/05/25) Final comment:

“PC is informed that as the business is recycling so much more waste, there is minimal that goes into the landfill. Therefore the maximum limits permissible under the original application have not been met. It is understood that this is a time extension, to allow the maximum permissible limits to be met, but not extend those limits nor extend the footprint of the landfill site. In addition, there is No concern on the part of the EA. It is understood that the landfill is now receiving clay deposits after re cycling. This is inert clay – any movement of this causing dust can be mitigated. On this basis the PC has no concerns.” – PC unanimously resolved. clerk to action

d. Any other planning matters – Update on Lorry Park HB((Email with full plan attached received from P Golding Principal Planning Officer EDDC). Email read out by chair JH & reviewed by PC.

Main points:-

-Officers have made substantial efforts to secure a landscaping scheme which includes a fence and additional planting to address impacts to residential amenity within the confines of the condition wording imposed by the inspector.

-in addition more detail has been secured on the intended surfacing – (chair JH read out in full)

- Drainage matters still outstanding and the objection raised by DCCs' LLFA have not yet been addressed. He has contacted the agent and also has requested a timetable for implementation of all issues as required by the condition. Once the surface water drainage has been resolved the council will be in a position to formally discharge the condition.

Greendale has not put plans in place to divert customers around the back as they have had to for the Cars and Cuppas events which they regularly hold. . Action: PC Councillor B Pearce offered to communicate with Greendale to implement the same solution as used for the Cars and Cuppas. PC agreed and thanked Cllr B P

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

CHURCH NEWS



We are glad to report that the work on the porch roof has now been completed and the scaffolding removed

The work was carried out by Robert Burrows of Williams and Burrows who are experience in Heritage work.

The work involved replacing the existing rotten lathes which new more substantial ones as well as a small amount of other work on the timber.

As recommended, to cater for the bats no felt is used and a special bat access tile has been incorporated on both sides of the roof.

Al of the tiles used are existing and include some with fluted edges which are now in a much better layout.



We now need to refurbish the rainwater goods on the south side of the church while fundraising and investigating grant sources for the similar re-roofing of the rest of the building which will involve a substantial amount of money.
